What is a Nurse Practitioner?

- A Nurse Practitioner is a Registered Nurse who has obtained advanced education at a Masters level.
- Nurse Practitioners work with other health care professionals including pharmacists, physicians, social workers, nurses, and mental health workers.
- As a member of your health care team, Nurse Practitioners offer a variety of health care services including the ability to:
 - Diagnose and treat illness and/or injuries
 - Perform physical examinations
 - Order and interpret diagnostic tests (e.g. bloodwork, urinalysis, etc.)
 - Write prescriptions
 - o Provide health education
 - Provide supportive care during illness
 - Make referrals to specialists and other health professionals

The Huron Perth Primary Care Nurse Practitioner Program consists of two programs:

Homeless Access to Care Program
Provides access to primary care to individuals experiencing
homelessness.
Eligibility
 Experiencing homelessness
 Currently without a Primary Care Provider
Resident of Huron or Perth County

Program Goals

- Provide temporary primary care to eligible patients who do not have primary care, until they are connected with a Primary Care Provider. Once a patient is connected with a Primary Care Provider, the goals of the program are met and they will no longer be eligible to return to program.
- Provide exceptional care by demonstrating trust, respect, fairness and compassion
- Provide personalized care while working within a multidisciplinary team
