

The Year in Review



O1 Amalgamation

 After 21 years operating as a voluntary alliance with a single board, staff and professional staff, the HPHA formally merged its four hospital corporations – Clinton Public Hospital, St. Marys Memorial Hospital, Seaforth Community Hospital, and Stratford General Hospital.



Accreditation Excellence

 Received Exemplary Standing in Ontario's first Collaborative Accreditation with Accreditation Canada, that included 10 separately governed organizations representing hospitals, primary care, home and community care, long term care and the Huron Perth & Area Ontario Health Team.



1 Infrastructure & Redevelopment

- Opened the new Cancer & Medical Care Clinic at Stratford General Hospital.
- Completed redevelopment of East Wing in St. Marys Memorial Hospital's Inpatient Unit.
- · Seaforth Community Hospital kitchen upgrade completed.



System Integration & Partnerships

Continued partnerships to improve patient care and flow, including:

- Alzheimer Society consultant in Stratford General Hospital Emergency Department to support dementia care.
- Let's Go Home (LEGHO) Project with ONECARE supported 92 patients, reducing alternate level of care (ALC) days.
- Nurse Practitioner led Primary Care Access Program for unattached patients.
- Mobile Crisis Team with local police/OPP for mental health support.



05 Equity & Inclusion Leadership

- Launched two Equity Change Plans to promote inclusion and anti-discrimination.
- Expanded Indigenous health supports: Land Acknowledgement, smudging policy, Ontario Health Indigenous Health Framework.
- Introduced gender-neutral signage, inclusive ID badges, cultural education, and inclusive language guide.



06 Enhancing Patient Experience

- Focus on improving communication at transition across inpatient units.
- Launching multi-language patient registration kiosks to improve access and experience.
- 20 active Patient & Caregiver Partners involved across Board of Directors, committees, and design teams (e.g., redevelopment projects).



Provider Support & Workforce Development

- Recruitment and retention programs: Nurse Residency, Clinical Scholars. New Grad Guarantee.
- Staff recognition, wellness initiatives, and leadership development.
- Housing and childcare supports for healthcare workers.



Safety & Quality Improvement

- · Launched unit-level Patient Safety Dashboards.
- Established Critical Incident and Clinical Audit teams.
- Focus on wound care and pressure injury prevention.
- · Ongoing "Never Events" reporting to enhance safety.



Advancing Palliative Care

- Delivered virtual palliative education to 26 staff members.
- Introduced standardized End-of-Life Kits and educational resources across departments.
- Continued support for Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) with organ donation facilitation.



Emergency Department Innovations

New Emergency Department initiatives:

- · Fit2Sit Program expansion.
- Elastomeric Pump Program for home antibiotic therapy.
- Community Paramedicine Referral Program for post-transition follow-up.
- Trialing Emergency Department Urgent Follow-Up Clinic to prevent unnecessary readmissions.

Our Foundations



Clinton Public Hospital Foundation

In 2024-2025, the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation transferred a total of \$432,261 to Clinton Public Hospital for capital equipment purchases. They found great success in initiatives like their Biennial Gala, Clinton Raceway's Legends Day, CKNX Healthcare Heroes Radiothon and their Christmas Letter Campaign.



Seaforth Community Hospital Foundation

The Seaforth Community Hospital Foundation is pleased to announce they donated \$270,025 to Seaforth Community Hospital in 2024-2025. Through a combination of Foundation and Hospital Infrastructure Renewal Funding, the hospital kitchen underwent a renovation complete with state-of-theart equipment.



St. Marys Healthcare Foundation

In 2024–2025, the St. Marys Healthcare Foundation raised \$719,320 through successful initiatives including the annual Golf Tournament, 'Be An Angel' campaign, Tim Hortons Smile Cookie campaign, and 50/50 lottery. Their largest contribution supported the redevelopment of the St. Marys Memorial Hospital Inpatient Unit.



Stratford General Hospital Foundation

In 2024-2025, the Stratford General Hospital Foundation disbursed over \$6.6 million to support the new Cancer & Medical Care Clinic, enhance patient care areas, fund vital programs, and upgrade equipment, marking one of its largest investments. This was made possible by the community's remarkable generosity and commitment to local healthcare.

In addition to the support of our foundations, the HPHA is fortunate to be supported by four dedicated volunteer and auxiliary groups. With 385 members across our sites, these individuals are an essential part of our hospital community, enhancing the patient experience, assisting with services, and leading impactful fundraising efforts.

Our Auxiliaries and Volunteer Groups



Clinton Public Hospital Auxiliary

The Clinton Public Hospital Auxiliary continues to make a strong impact through volunteer support and fundraising, including the Gift of Lights and the annual Penny Sale. This year, \$17,800 was donated to the Foundation for essential equipment including a vending machine, negative pressure wound vac, and Roho cushion.



Seaforth Community Hospital Volunteer Council

This year, the Seaforth Volunteer Council expanded support for inpatients, registration, and therapies, while also welcoming emergency and rehab patients. With the Tree of Lights raising \$2,700 and the Gift Shop reopening soon, volunteers continue to enhance care in meaningful ways.



St. Marys Memorial Hospital Auxiliary

The St. Marys Memorial Hospital Auxiliary strengthens community ties through bake sales, staff gifts, and patient initiatives like fidget aprons and therapy visits. This year, they also funded a \$5,200 negative pressure wound vac to support patient care.



Volunteers of Stratford General Hospital

Our growing volunteer team continues to enhance patient care through clinical support, peer mentoring, art therapy, and more. This year, they surpassed their \$85,000 fundraising goal for the new Cancer & Medical Care Clinic, thanks to efforts like the 'Christmas in July' Raffle and volunteer-run Coffee Shop and Gift Shop.
